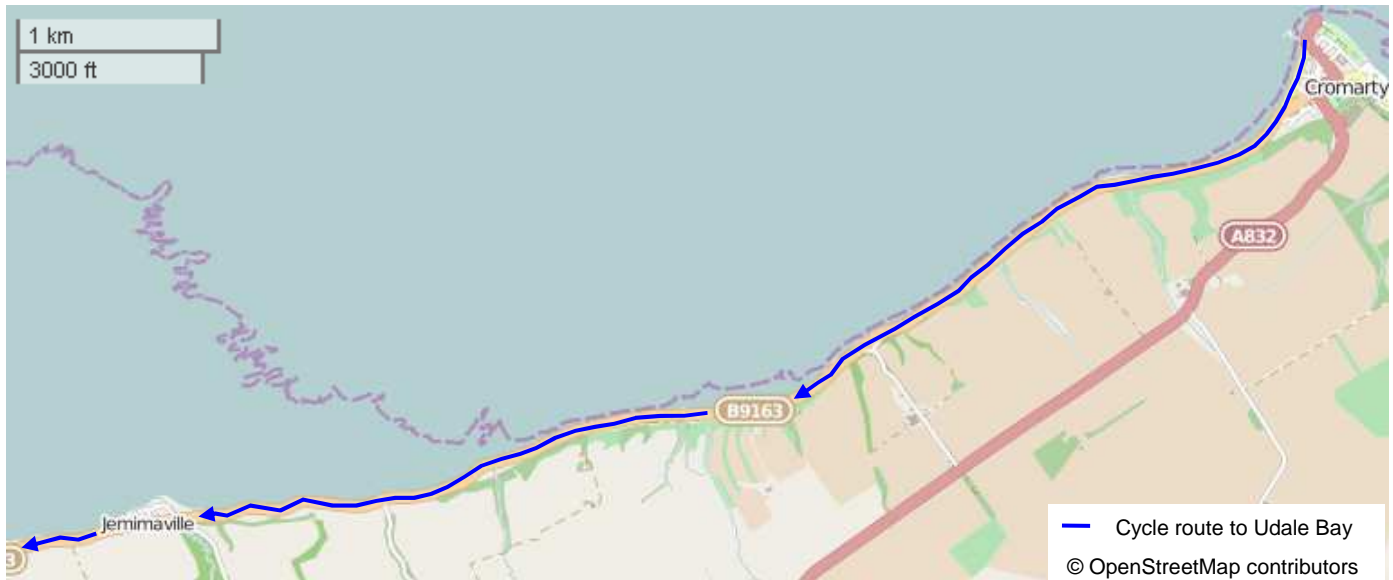

Route Description:

From the harbour in Cromarty, cycle west along the north coast of the Black Isle along the B9163. The road is generally quiet, and there are views of the Cromarty Firth.

Follow the road, passing through Jemimaville until you reach a lay-by on the right hand side – if you reach a T-junction, you've gone too far!

In the lay-by is a small interpretation board, a bicycle rack and a hide for viewing the birds. Leave the bikes here and pop in the hide with your binoculars to see flocks of wildfowl and wading birds.

Retrace your ride to Cromarty to refresh and refuel!

Remember to:

- Check the weather before you set out.
- Take spare clothing, food and water.
- Take care around other trail users.
- Tell someone where you are going.
- Ride within your limits, and watch your speed.
- Take only photos, leave only tyre tracks.
